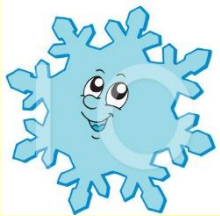

Ms. Pam, Megan, and Rachel

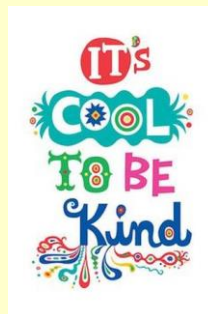
- We will be continuing our study on trees in December. We will also focus on different cultural celebrations.
