### **Ms. Brandi**


- Please make sure you are checking your child's folders daily, as well as cleaning the items out that we send home.

## Reminders to Parents

- Continue to log your volunteer hours and turn in your log by the end of the month
- PLEASE keep your child home: if s/he is showing any symptoms that could be COVID related, if s/he has been exposed to anyone who has tested positive for COVID, if anyone in your home is sick or having COVID symptoms, if anyone in your home is going to be tested for COVID, if anyone in your home has been tested for COVID and you are waiting for results.
- Symptoms of COVID include: fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea.
- I understand that these symptoms can occur with other illnesses, but we have to be cautious now that we live in a world where COVID-19 exists.
- If there is any type of exposure in the classroom, or if someone in the classroom lives with a person who has tested positive, CenClear will require a 14- day quarantine for the entire class.
- My hope is that we can stay in class and finish the year as scheduled. We all need to do our part to stop the virus from spreading.
- Please remember, anytime we are remote, you must communicate with me that your child has completed one or more of the assigned remote activities to be marked present for the day. You can communicate through the Teaching Strategies app, text, messenger, the class Facebook page, etc.
